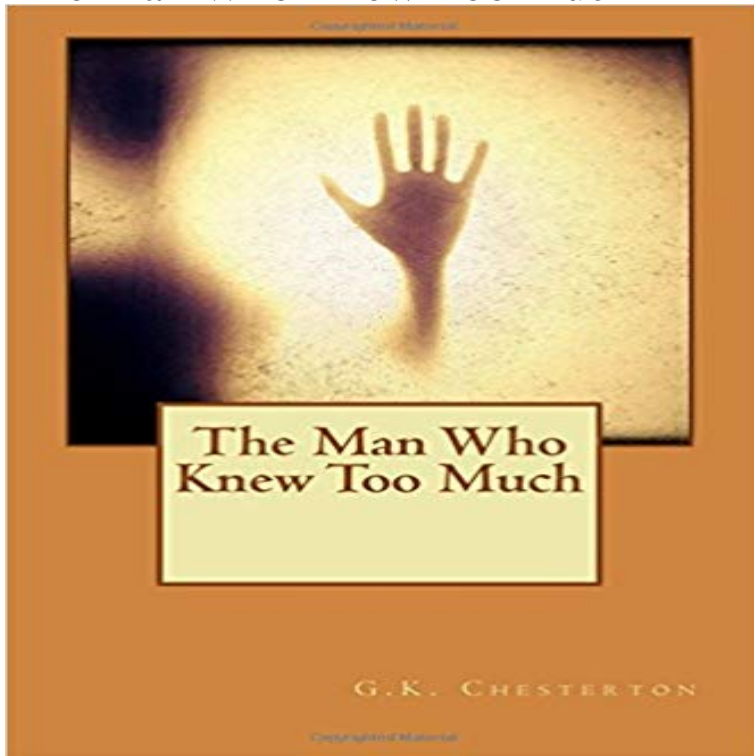


## The Man Who Knew Too Much
